### NEW BUSINESS:

# A. Proposed FY 2013-2014 Budget and Property Tax Mileage Rate

#### Moved by Gambka, Second by Trevethan, motion never voted on.

Scheib-Snider states we need a public hearing in order to approve the Budget. Can hold discussion tonight but she will not approve budget tonight.

Trevethan, p. 4, DPW, Citizen Services \$3,750.00, asks if this is for OLHSA. Supervisor Gambka responds yes.

Miller states the Public Hearing was published May 28, 2013 in the Tri-County Times.

Supervisor Gambka states there was an increase in projected revenues. Revenue Sharing going from \$450,000.00 to \$471,000.00. Tax Revenues will be approximately \$215,000.00 v. \$205,000.00 this year. Seeing a recovery in all revenues. Rose Township has one of Oakland County's lowest tax rates. We are in a good position.

Supervisor Gambka states based on projections, Budget will be \$837,520.00 (p. 1), approximately \$214,600.00 received by Oakland County.

P. 323, \$16,000.00 health insurance retiree expenses. 801 – Contractual Services represents audit fee in the amount of \$13,500.00. Acct. 9300 - \$13,060.00 to \$3,600.00. This was more expensive due to one-time expenses (i.e., server, signage, etc.).

P. 423, 463 public works, previously approved, graveling at \$132,000.00 with our share being \$43,785.00 and chloride \$78,000.00.

Total appropriations \$829,173.00, balanced Budget at \$8,000.00.

Current Budget showing a surplus of approximately \$200,000.00, will probably end up with a \$100,000.00 surplus. We should spend money on public services. Proposing salary increases for Board Officers

(Supervisor, Clerk, Treasurer), current salaries - \$45,000.00, proposing \$50,000.00 and an increase in deputy wages. The last officer increase in salary was eight (8) years ago.

Kemp states Township offices used to be open five (5) days a week, now four (4), have adjustments been made? Supervisor Gambka states yes, work thirty-two (32) hour work week and have compared with other areas.

Supervisor Gambka suggests office hours be 8:30 a.m. – 5:30 p.m. and deputies ten (10%) percent increase. Supervisor, Clerk and Treasurer increase to \$50,000.00/year, deputy treasurer ten (10%) percent increase, and deputy clerk needs to be adjusted to find qualified individual. Miller states the deputy clerk work load is much larger and requires vast knowledge base.

Kemp requests comparisons before supporting a motion.

Scheib-Snider states candidates ran for office knowing the salary questions Zoning Admin Plewes where his salary is and it looks like a decrease.

Miller states Plewes is in several different categories, his salary is \$31,000.00, split between p. 323 zoning enforcement wages, p. 2 facilities management and zoning administrator.

Supervisor Gambka believes this is a fair budget.

Kemp states he would like to investigate the proposed wage increase especially in lieu of annual meeting.

Scheib-Snider said she is not comfortable voting since the Public Hearing was never published in the paper.

Supervisor Gambka opens the floor to a public hearing at 8:04 p.m.

Unidentified Resident complains about public hearing notices in the paper.

<u>Unidentified Resident</u> complains about discontinuing annual meeting then, raising wages. Feels Board should be taking a pay cut.

<u>Theresa Lynn, Resident</u> states when we hold a public hearing it is placed in publications, should also be put on Agenda and emailed to citizens. There is no mention of public hearing on this Agenda. Resident does not believe a fair public hearing can be held.

<u>Marilee Carstens, Resident</u> reiterates Ms. Lynn's views. Confused how we have flipped to public hearing when it was not on the Agenda.

# Moved by Gambka, seconded by Kemp, motion carried to table the Budget approval and public hearing until the June 26, 2013 meeting.

Miller states salary approval is typically handled in April/May and the annual meeting can never reduce a salary, only increase. Scheib-Snider states a public hearing is necessary and legal and not published. Supervisor Gambka will have the Clerk review legalities. Miller states the budget hearing was published and discussed at the last meeting. Supervisor Gambka will provide the public with additional time at next budget meeting.
