BRIEF PUBLIC COMMENTS/AGENDA ITEMS ONLY (limit comments to 3 minutes each item):

<u>Jim Walters, Resident</u> states he supports the re-establishment of the Lake Braemar Special Assessment District ("SAD"), but raises objection to maintaining the current SAD surplus, suggests reduction.

<u>Bill Chatfield, Resident</u> and chairperson of the Lake Braemar Management Committee, states the Committee is served voluntarily and handles weed control, lake water quality, etc. Lake expenses are submitted to the Board for approval. Resident further states this SAD has been in place for twenty (20) years and maintains the quality of the lake. The SAD balance in 2008 was \$50,339.00, as of October 31, 2015 the balance is \$50,772.00. It is clear the amount of money collected is exactly what is necessary to preserve the lake's water quality; costs are unlikely to go down. Resident asks the Board to support this SAD and reminds the Board that the vast majority of lake residents support the same.

<u>Don Perez, Resident</u> states he supports the SAD, but is concerned that there is a \$50,000.00 balance. This amount is too high, consider a cap.

<u>PUBLIC HEARING for Creation/Renewal of Special Assessment District for the Purpose of Controlling Aquatic Weed and Protecting the Water Quality in Lake Braemar.</u>

Open Public Hearing at 7:15 p.m.

<u>Jack Prechowski, Resident</u> states he has been informed by other districts, \$100,000.00 would not be an unreasonable amount to hold in a fund in order to protect against potential catastrophic incidents (damns breaking, etc.).

<u>John Kohls, Resident</u> states he resides on the lake and does not believe the SAD should carry excess amounts. Resident states there is enough money in the fund to treat the lake for two (2) years.

<u>Unidentified Resident</u> explains there have not been any problems in the last seven (7) years. \$23,000.00 is the right amount of money. Maintenance will never be "done", and would not want to be scrambling if a problem occurred, trying to collect money.

<u>Unidentified Resident</u> states a dam inspection is necessary every five (5) years, conducted by an engineer, action would be taken upon their recommendation. The dam has always been in good condition, making a catastrophic failure unlikely, \$50,000.00 will not cover full replacement of a failed dam.

<u>Unidentified Resident</u> supports what is being done now, agrees with a buffer.

<u>Unidentified Resident</u> asks should the Board not approve the SAD, will collection be possible? Supervisor Gambka responds yes.

Unidentified Resident states the lake residents were not given options.
